The Method Expanded (A)

Before you get started on this lesson, review Module 3, Lesson 1 on *The Method is About Truth*.



In the next two lessons, we're breaking down the dichotomies of *research*. For this lesson, we're focusing on *facts*.

Webster's 1828 Dictionary defines *fact* as:



FACT, noun [Latin factum, from facio, to make or do.]

1. Any thing done, or that comes to pass; an act; a **deed**; an **effect** produced or achieved; an **event**. Witnesses are introduced into court to prove a fact Facts are stubborn things. To deny a fact knowingly is to lie.

2. Reality; truth; as, in fact So we say, indeed.

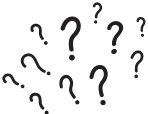

We can see *facts* in this way:

Deed
That which is done or acted,
whatever is done,
good or bad, great or small.

Event/Consequence
The consequence of any thing; the
issue; That which follows from any
act, **cause, principle.**

Effect
That which is **produced by** an
agent or cause; Reality; not mere
appearance; fact.

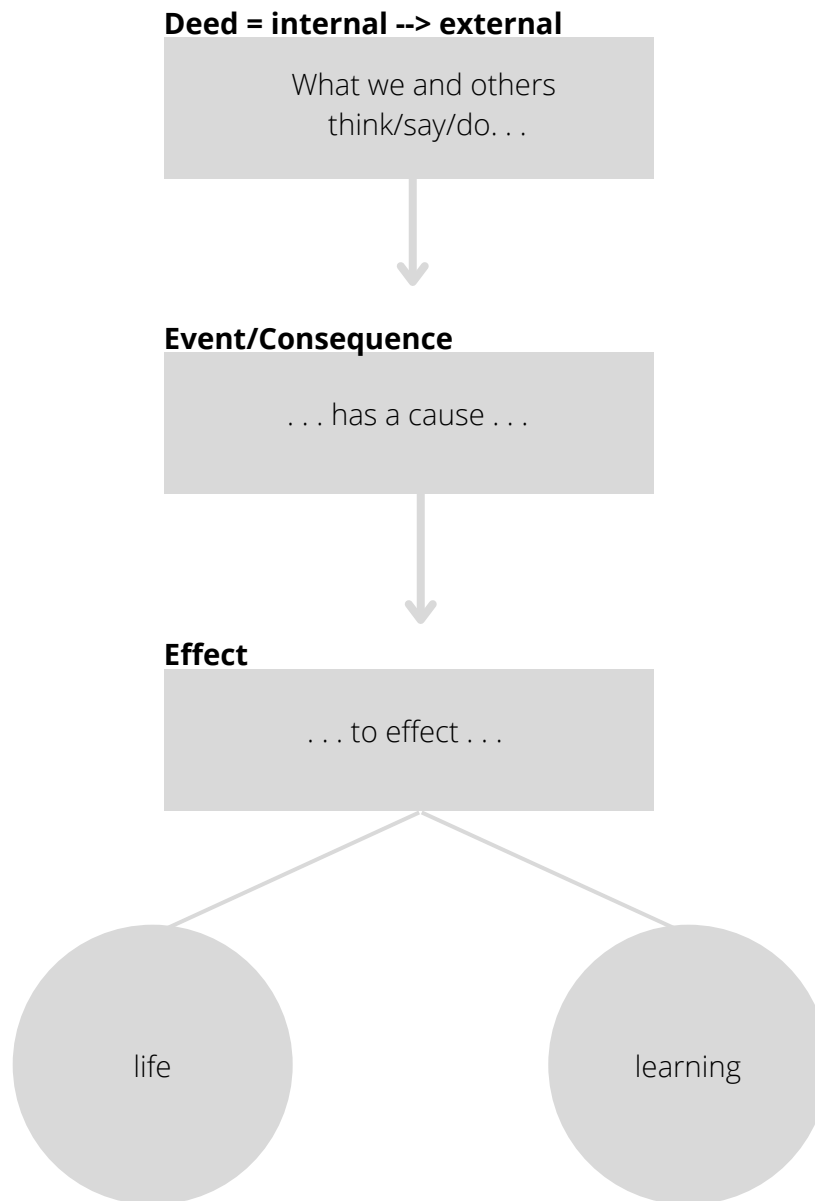


In the context of this definition for *event/consequence*, which definition of *principle* is a proper fit?
